
## **CHEMISTRY REDISCOVERED 2018**

This year, the European Young Chemists' Network (EYCN) will organize the second edition of the video contest *Chemistry Rediscovered* in honour of the International Year of the Periodic Table of Chemical Elements (IYPT) in 2019.

Young chemists (12-35 years old) are invited to send in creative videos of maximum 90 seconds on the theme: "*In your element*". Detailed information about the contest and all video requirements can be found in the *Rules and Regulations* below.

The contest will be split in two groups depending on the participants' education level, which will be judged separately. In March 2019, the winning videos will be published online, so winners, European chemists, and the global public can enjoy and be inspired by this work.

The principal purpose of this project is to encourage young chemists to get creative with chemistry. In doing this, the hope is that they will inspire others to think and talk about science in a new and different way. Secondly, this project aims to celebrate the IYPT within the network of EYCN and to make more young chemists familiar with this special celebration.





# -Rules and Regulations-

## 1. Competition Timeline

- a) **EYCN Official Launching of the contest:** 1<sup>st</sup> October 2018;
- b) **Deadline for applications:** 31st January 2019;
- c) **Assessment:** 1<sup>st</sup> February 2019 27<sup>th</sup> February 2019;
- d) **Results:** 18<sup>th</sup> March 2019 (winners will be contacted by e-mail);
- e) **Official presentation of winning videos:** 20<sup>th</sup>-23<sup>th</sup> March 2019 during the 2<sup>nd</sup> European Young Chemists Meeting (EYCheM) in Bremen (Germany);
- f) **Publishing of the winning video online:** end of March 2019 (through EYCN and its partner channels).

## 2. Registration

The application form should include:

- Information about the contestant(s): name, age, country, name of the institute (school/university/company), level of education (pupil/undergraduate/student/PhD) and e-mail address:
- A written description of the video of max 350 words;
- A video file, illustrating the theme *In your element*;
  Note that the video can be experimental or non-experimental. *In case of an experimental video*: a (short) experimental protocol should be added, containing *Introduction, Materials and Methods, Safety Rules and Procedures, Results, Discussion* and *Conclusions*.
- For contestants under the age of 18: written permission of a legal guardian has to be added, that allows participation in the contest.

The application files should be sent to <a href="mailto:science@eycn.eu">science@eycn.eu</a> via <a href="mailto:WeTransfer">WeTransfer</a>. If a file exceeds the 2GB limit, the organization can be contacted via <a href="mailto:science@eycn.eu">science@eycn.eu</a> and then an alternative submission method will be arranged.

Within 48h contestants will receive a confirmation of receipt of their submission.

#### 3. Contestant requirements



Every young chemist or interested person who complies with the age requirement (12-35 years old) can participate in this competition, either alone or in a team of up to 4 people.

## 4. Video requirements

Any submitted video should not surpass a maximum length of 90 seconds. Also the video should be understandable for an international jury and audience, which means it should either be a non-spoken video or be provided with English subtitles.

## 5. Jury

All submitted videos will be evaluated by the organizers of this competition (EYCN Science Team members and involved organizers). A selection of videos will then be judged by an international jury composed by the EYCN Board, part of the EuChemS Executive Board and a representative from the IUPAC 100.

#### 6. Evaluation

Submissions to the contest will be split into two groups depending on the participants' education level: pupils ranging from 12 to 18 years old and early career chemists ranging from 19 to 35 years old. These two groups will be judged separately.

The final evaluation of the videos will be performed by an international jury according to the following criteria:

- Creativity, originality, and the extent to which the content seeks to inspire others about chemistry;
- Relevance and compatibility with the competition theme;
- Scientific accuracy of the concepts presented in the video.

## 7. Awards

The official display of the winning videos will take place during the 47<sup>th</sup> IUPAC World Chemistry Congress in Paris, July 2019. The winner(s) will be invited to Paris, to be part of this special event.



Further prizes for the winning entries will be announced throughout the duration of the competition via EYCN channels.

In case a team of multiple contestants wins a prize, this prize will be divided among them. In case of a tie between multiple teams/contestants, the winner will be decided by a casting vote.

All participants of the competition will receive a copy of the EuChemS Periodic Table, specially designed on the occasion of the International Year of the Periodic Table in 2019. In addition to that they have a chance to win other Periodic Table related goodies.

Specifics of prizes are the organizer's sole discretion. Prizes are not transferable; no substitutions are permitted. All taxes and any other costs related to this prize not specifically stated within these Rules & Regulations are the sole responsibility of the winner(s).

## 8. Promotion/Publicity

By submitting an entry, you grant EYCN and its partners the right to use information and content provided by you for publicity and institutional promotional purposes to the extent permitted by law. You understand and agree that EYCN may request more information from you for such purposes, should your video become a finalist or a prize-winner. You also agree not to claim or imply for any reason that EYCN and its partners are not entitled to use your video.

#### 9. Rights and Distribution

By submitting your video into this competition, you hereby grant to EYCN the royalty-free non-exclusive right to publish in print and online, and to distribute your video in whole or in part. EYCN is not assuming any obligation hereunder to distribute any picture/video submitted to the contest.

## 10. Conditions In Respect Of Use

You understand and agree that once you submit or attempt to submit your video, it is an entry into the competition. You shall have no right to prohibit, restrict, revoke or terminate any of the rights granted to EYCN hereunder. Moreover, you understand and acknowledge that you are not entitled to any compensation or other consideration for your video once submitted into the contest.



## 11. Privacy/Your Representations

By submitting an entry each entrant confirms in respect of any content submitted that:

- entrant and any identifiable person on the video has waived their rights to privacy on the video;
- any identifiable person on the video has consented to the entry of the video in this competition on the terms and conditions set out herein;
- the entrant is/you are the sole author and owner of the copyright of the video; your picture does not contain any copyrighted material. The author of the video will be responsible for securing the licensing rights. To avoid the expense and difficulty of securing such rights, we recommend using only original, non-copyrighted material or material licensed under the Creative Commons Attribution-ShareAlike license;
- you warrant that the video contains no libelous or unlawful statements, does not infringe upon the rights (including, but not limited to the copyright, patent or trademark rights) or the privacy of others, or contain material or instructions that might cause harm or injury;
- written permission has been obtained from the legal guardian of any minor appearing on the video;
- Copyright in your contribution will remain with you and this permission is not exclusive,
  so you can continue to use the material in any way including allowing others to use it.
